Job description

The Fellow will be exposed to all aspects of Hip and Knee Arthroplasty surgery including new robotic innovations. They will undertake supervised arthroplasty and arthroscopy surgery at St John of God Hospital Midland 1 day per fortnight, assisting both supervisors for complex revision cases, suitable teaching cases and robotic arthroplasty surgery. There is also a fortnightly trauma requirement. There is an opportunity to undertake approx. 7 joint replacement, arthroscopic and trauma cases per week as the primary surgeon dependent on assessment of ability.

The Fellow will be involved in teaching the service registrars and junior doctors during clinical time and one hour of formal teaching per fortnight.

There is an opportunity to undertake research and Fellows will attend fortnightly research and Xray meetings.

The successful candidate must have full fellowship in Orthopaedic Surgery with RACS and Australian Orthopaedic Association or equivalent. Full registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency is mandated.

The applicant(s) must be within three years of their qualifications and must be well versed in general and trauma orthopaedics.

Overseas candidates must comply with requirements to enter Australia on an occupational training visa.

This Fellowship is accredited by the Australian Orthopaedic Association.

About the location

He completed his residency and advanced surgical training in Perth, at the Royal Perth Hospital. After gaining FRACS Ortho in 1994, he undertook three years of overseas fellowship training in the area of hip and knee arthroplasty and revision surgery, initially at the Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre, Oxford UK, followed by a further year at the Cleveland Clinic, Ohio, and finally a fellowship in pelvic and acetabular trauma at Parkland Memorial Trauma Centre, Dallas Texas.

Mr Collopy works as a Consultant at Royal Perth Hospital and St John of God Private Hospitals in Perth. His research interests are in hip and knee implant design and fixation, and was one of the design surgeons on the Emperion revision hip system, the Triathlon knee system and the AccoladeII hip system. He, together with his partner Mr Gavin Clark, is involved in developing robotics in knee and hip replacement. He is the immediate Past-President of the Arthroplasty Society of Australia, and is currently the Chairman of the WA State branch of the AOA. He sits on numerous committees, including the AOA Scientific Committee, the COE Committee, and the NJRR Committee.

Mr Clark is an experienced Knee and Hip Surgeon with over 10 years experience as a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon. He has sub specialist training in joint replacement surgery and arthroscopic sports surgery of the lower limb. Mr Clark is active in the field of research and training. He is currently enrolled at UWA undertaking a PhD looking at ways of improving outcomes in knee replacement surgery.

Mr Clark is Head of the Orthopaedic Department at St John of God Midland Public and Private Hospitals. He has a long term interest in computer assisted joint replacement and is also heavily involved in the introduction of Robotic technology in Arthroplasty to Australia with the Stryker Mako system installed at SJOG Subiaco Hospital.
